The Alexander Rutherford Scholarship from the Alberta Heritage Fund:

Grade 10 - \$300 for 75% – 79.9% - \$400 for 80% and higher

Grade 11 - \$500 for 75% - 79.9% - \$800 for 80% and higher

Grade 12 - \$700 for 75% - 79.9% - \$1300 for 80% and higher

Students that maintain 80% average starting in Grade 10-12 receive money from the Heritage Fund. Grade 10 (1 English, 2 of the following Math, Science, Social) any 2 other grade level subjects. Grade 11 (1 English, 2 of the following Math, Science, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Social Studies any other 2 grade level subjects) Grade 12 (1 English 4 of the following Math, Science, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, Social Studies)

Calculation of Honor Roll/Valedictorian

The criteria for the Rutherford Scholarship act as the foundation for the determination of the Valedictorian and/or Honor roll in the Senior High. In the junior high, all four core courses must be used in the calculation.

The honor roll is slightly different than the Rutherford in the sense that the average is based on courses taken in that report card year, regardless of the grade designation (e.g. World Geo 30)
